

Harmonious partnerships are the result of hard work; they never "just happen." I don't know of anything that helps this process more than deep, honest, regular communication... . That's not just talking; it's also listening. And not just listening, but also hearing. Not just hearing, but also responding, calmly and kindly.

The "hard work" also includes giving just as much as taking, … forgiving as quickly as confronting, putting into the marriage more than you ever expect out of it. In one word it means being *unselfish*.

Love ... does not seek its own, is not provoked.

1 CORINTHIANS 13:4 - 5



Whenever the New Testament lingers on the subject of sensual temptation, it gives us one command: RUN! The Bible does not tell us to reason with it. In its earliest form the word *peace* meant "to bind together" and came to include the whole idea of being bound so closely together with something or someone that a harmony resulted. The right woman who is joined in harmony with the right man in marriage begins a "peaceful" companionship. One friend who is joined in heart and soul to another friend sustains a "peaceful" relationship where harmony exists. When there is such grace-and-peace harmony, choosing joy flows naturally.

Pressured by the tension between pleasing your boss, who can fire you or demote you or just make your life difficult, and your commitment to Christ, you need the inner resources to stand firm. The good news is this: you have it! The provision Christ gives will be sufficient for such a stress test.

You have need of endurance, so that when you have done the will of God, you may receive what was promised.

PROVERBS 29:23



The secret to responsible trust is *acceptance*. Acceptance is taking from God's hand absolutely anything He gives, looking into His face in trust and thanksgiving, knowing that the confinement of the hedge we're in is good and for His glory. Even though what we're enduring may be painful, it's good simply because God Himself has allowed it. Acceptance is resting in God's goodness, believing that He has all things under His control—even people who are doing what is wrong. Yes ... even wrongdoers.

Someone has said, "Education is going from an unconscious to conscious awareness of one's ignorance." I agree. No one has a corner on wisdom.  ${f T}$ wo words will help you cope when you run low on hope: accept and trust.

Accept the mystery of hardship, suffering, misfortune, or mistreatment. Don't try to understand it or explain it. Accept it. Then, deliberately trust God to protect you by His power from this very moment to the dawning of eternity.

The LORD will be your confidence and will keep your foot from being caught.

PROVERBS 3:26



Under heaven's lock and key, we are protected by the most efficient security system available— the power of God. There is no way we will be lost in the process of suffering. No disorder, no disease, not even death itself can weaken or threaten God's ultimate protection over our lives. No matter what the calamity, no matter what the disappointment or depth of pain, no matter what kind of destruction occurs in our bodies at the time of death, our souls are divinely protected.

We ... are protected by the power of God, through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.

PSALM 62:5



PSALM 42:1



God's plan doesn't require a drum roll or crashing cymbals. He doesn't use neon signs blinking, "Get ready! Get ready! Today's the day I do something big in your life."

That's not His style. God works by simply stepping into an ordinary day of life and saying what He wants to say. It's a meat-and-potatoes kind of proposition. Here's what needs doing, and you're the person who's going to do it, so let's get after it!

PROVERBS 8:22



As you read these words, you may find yourself in a situation that seems terribly unfair.

It hurts to endure life's trials, and it hurts worse to repeat such episodes. Yet, without those deep hurts, we have very little capacity to receive godly counsel or make forward progress toward maturity.

PSALM 9:9



Some of us make grumbling a habit. Whether we're moving along in traffic or have been served a late meal, whether we're planning a last-minute arrangement with someone or working with a difficult group, we're given to complaining and grousing. It's like we have "the gift of grumbling" and feel we ought to exercise it, with gusto!

Are you prone to complaining? Remember, God is the one who has made your

circumstances to be what they are. Don't blame someone else.

He has made everything beautiful in its time.

ECCLESIASTES 3:11 , NKJV





No one else is exactly like you. Refuse to compare or control.



Somewhere, miles away, crops push their way toward harvest and waves roar and tumble onto shore. Windswept forests sing their timeless songs, and desert animals scurry in the shadows of cactus and rock.

Within a matter of hours night will fall, the dark sky will glitter with moon and stars, and sleep will force itself upon us. Life will continue on uninterrupted. Appreciated or not, the canvas of nature will go on being painted by the fingers of God.

Be exalted, OGod, above the heavens, and Your glory above all the earth.

PSALM 108:5



When you meet with God, open the Bible. Don't rely on your memory; rely on those printed pages.

Start at the beginning of a book of the Bible and work your way through it, slowly and systematically. Read it aloud. Read it thoughtfully. Listen to what your lips say and ask Him to make what you hear come alive in your life. Block out everything else. Pray it. Personalize it. Sing it. Make it a part of your conscious thought, and forget everything else as you give that time to Him.

O how I love Your law! It is my meditation all the day.

PSALM 119:97



Do you have an uncaring boss? Do you have a supervisor or a manager who isn't fair? Do you have to deal with unreasonable people?

The natural tendency of the human heart is to fight back against unfair and unreasonable treatment. But seeking revenge for unjust suffering can be a sign of self-appointed lordship over one's own affairs. Revenge, then, is totally inappropriate for one who has submitted to the lordship of Jesus Christ.

Be submissive to your masters with all respect, not only to those who are good and gentle, but also to those who are unreasonable.

1 PETER 2:18



Make a plan right now to keep a daily appointment with God. The enemy is going to tell you to set it aside, to do something else. He'll whisper, "You're far too involved with other things, far too busy." But every excuse he suggests is a lie.

If you're too busy to meet with the Lord, friend, then you are simply too busy. I repeat, you *must* carve out the time. Why not establish a plan before you go to bed tonight?

Let us come before His presence with thanksgiving.

PSALM 95:2



The devil preys most greedily upon the godly. If you compromise your walk, you're not really a target of the enemy. Why should he waste his time? You're already halfway in his camp. But if you determine to stand alone and against the tide; if you determine to live according to biblical standards, be sure that your enemy is seeking to devour you.

But our great hope and assurance is that the One in us is greater than the one in the world.

Be self-controlled and alert. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion.

1 PETER 5:8 - 9, NIV



When you determine to be a person sold out to God—not just a run-of-the-mill, mediocre Christian accepting Christ as a fire escape—you become the object of God's

special attention. He says He "sets you apart" for Himself. And the verse adds, "The Lord hears when I call to Him." Those two thoughts fit together. The godly often need to call upon God when the perils come. So He says, "I am here and I will answer. I will hear what you have to say."

The LORD has set apart the godly man for himself; the LORD hears when I call to Him.

PSALM 4:3



Has a friend betrayed you? ... Has a disaster dropped on your life that's almost too great [to bear? If so, don't fight back. Unjust suffering can be a dizzying experience. To keep your balance in those times when things are swirling around you, it's important to find a fixed reference point and focus on it. Return to the protection and guardianship of the Good Shepherd who endured the cross and laid down His life ... for you.

I am the good shepherd; the good shepherd lays down His life for the sheep.

JOHN 10:11



Awife is not responsible for her husband's life. She is responsible for her life. You cannot make your husband something he is not. Only God can do that.

I think it was the evangelist's wife, Ruth Graham, who once said, "It is my job to love Billy. It is God's job to make him good." I'd call that a wonderful philosophy for any wife to embrace.

He who has My commandmentsand keeps them is the one who Loves Me.

JOHN 14:21



You're not indispensable. I'm not indispensable. Nobody is indispensable, except the Lord l Jesus Christ. He's the head. He's the Preeminent One. He's the founder. He's in first place. And when He moves one and brings in another or demotes one and sets up another, He calls the shots. That is His sovereign right. The problem arises when we get to thinking we're sovereign. My friend, He put you where He wanted you. He gave you that job. He can take it away just as fast as He gave it. Just faithfully do your work, lie low, and exalt Christ.

JOHN 17:23



Wouldn't you love the ability to go back in time and change something you did or said? But the sad fact is, we cannot go back. None of us can. We cannot undo sinful deeds or unsay sinful words. We cannot reclaim those moments when we were possessed by rage, or lust, or cruelty, or indifference, or hard-headed pride. We may be forgiven for those sins and have them blotted out of our record by the blood of Christ. Even so, we must live with the consequences of our words and our actions. What we sow, the Scriptures warn, we will also reap.

Whatever a man sows, this he will also reap.



Only two things on earth are eternal: people and the Bible. When you're planning on retirement, don't plan on checking out with people or with God's Word. If you do, you'll be moving away from that which is eternal, and that's the wrong direction, my friend. So stay in touch. Give until you don't have anything else to give, and then tap into God's reservoirs and give some more. This is what lengthens the meaning and purpose—and sometimes the years—of life.

He will not often consider the years of his life, because God keeps him occupied with the gladness of his heart.

ECCLESIASTES 5:20



God uses an infinite number of vehicles in the process of helping us grow. I do not know of any means that leads to instant growth. I've never met anyone who became instantly mature. It's a painstaking process that God takes us through, and it includes such things as waiting, failing, losing, and being misunderstood—each one calling for extra doses of perseverance.

Christian growth comes through hard-core, gutsy perseverance.

Apply your heart to discipline and your ears to words of knowledge.

PROVERBS 23:12



Want a challenge? Start modeling the truth ... the whole truth and nothing but the truth, so help you God. Think truth. Confess truth. Face truth. Love truth. Pursue truth. Walk truth. Talk truth. Ah, that last one! That's a good place to begin. From this day forward, deliberately, consciously, and conscientiously speak the truth. Start practicing gut-level authenticity.

Give instruction to a wise man and he will be still wiser.

PROVERBS 9:9



External beauty is ephemeral. Internal beauty is eternal. The former is attractive to the world; the latter is pleasing to God. Peter describes this inner beauty as "a gentle and quiet spirit." This might be paraphrased "a gentle tranquility." Without question, this is any woman's most powerful quality—true character. And such character comes from within—from the hidden person of the heart—because you know who you are and you know who you adore and serve, the Lord Christ.

Your adornment must not be merely external ... but let it be ... a gentle and quiet spirit, which is precious in the sight of God.

1 PETER 3:3 - 4



 \mathbf{G} od's goal for us as husbands is to be sensitive rather than to prove how strong and

macho we are. We need to love our wives, listen to them, adapt to their needs. We need to say no to more and more in our work so we can say yes to more and more in our homes ... so we can say yes to the needs of our children and our families. (How else will your children learn what it means to be a good husband and father?)

The merciful man does himself good.

PROVERBS 11:17



 ${f B}$ elievers who are growing toward maturity share in mutual feelings—mutual woes and mutual joys.

This is one of the best benefits of being part of the body of Christ and a major reason why we need to be involved in a local church. In that local community we have a context in which we can rejoice with each other and weep with one another.

Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep.

ROMANS 12:15
